

Sports Premium Impact Report 2023/24

Sports Premium Funding this year was £18,210.00

We allocated the amount to:

OPAL – includes play leader training and ongoing support through the OPAL college; a variety of play equipment for OPAL such as sledges, scooters and den making items;

Sports Equipment – includes PE equipment for lessons and resourcing the curriculum such as balls, bats, hockey sticks, athletic equipment.

Sporting Fixtures – local schools' tournaments after school

Key Points around OPAL:

- We have a Play Leader who is completing her training with OPAL alongside our Play Team and Deputy Head Teacher.
- Years 1 – 6 use OPAL at lunch times to access the range of activities available to them.
- Year R use OPAL equipment and spaces during their Discovery Play as appropriate and are taught more about in the Summer Term by their Year 5 buddy.
- Risk Assessments are completed with the children before any new equipment is introduced to ensure equipment is played with safely. These are reviewed by the play team and readdressed in assembly time if required.
- Staff, parental and child feedback has been positive about our OPAL lunchtimes.
- Children are more active outside at lunch time due to the number of activities offered alongside building social skills, and problem-solving skills.
- Children engage in den building, ramps to leap and run from, scooter play, ball games, building obstacle courses

Future Development:

- We are keen to develop our OPAL to become part of the children's outdoor learning curriculum across the school which will be a focus for 2024/25

Swimming:

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

Have you used it in this way? Children have swimming lessons in Year 4 and then we do a follow-up course for children who have not met the standard in Year 5.
